

## MEASURES FOR PROVINCES WITH CONFIRMED COVID-19 CASES

- I, Commissioner David Manning, Emergency Controller, by virtue of the Emergency (General Provisions) (COVID 19) Regulation 2020 (Regulation) and other Emergency Laws, hereby issue the following emergency orders for immediate implementation:
- 1. The measures set out in this Emergency Order apply to provinces or regions within Papua New Guinea that the Emergency Controller has officially confirmed to have a positive COVID-19 case(s).
- 2. Between the hours of 8pm and 6am daily, no person shall be allowed outside of their dwelling place, unless:
  - a. to seek urgent medical assistance;
  - b. in case of an emergency (including but not limited to a fire); and
  - c. an exempted person listed in Schedule 1.
- 3. All forms of public gatherings are prohibited, except for markets, hotels, restaurants and shops which may remain open.
- 4. All persons must adhere to social distancing requirements, and safe and hygienic practices.
- 5. For purposes of this Order, no persons shall gather in groups of more than 4 persons in public places.
- 6. All forms of public transportation are prohibited.
- 7. The sale and purchase of alcohol is prohibited.
- 8. All previous Emergency Orders continue to apply, unless provided for specifically in this Emergency Order.



# MEASURES FOR PROVINCES WITH CONFIRMED COVID-19 CASES

- 9. Non-compliance with this Emergency Order should be reported to an authorised officer or the Provincial Police Commander.
- 10. This Emergency Order confirms any actions or measures taken during the declared National Emergency, and non-compliance hereafter is punishable under the Regulation or other Emergency Laws.
- 11. Any Authorised Officer(s) appointed by the Emergency Controller pursuant to the Regulation, shall carry out and enforce the Emergency Orders accordingly.
- 12. This Emergency Order shall apply for 21 days upon the declaration of a province having a confirmed case of Covid-19, unless extended by the Emergency Controller.

13. This order comes into effect on 08 April 2020.
